The Asian American Studies Program is proud to announce the Asian American Studies Scholarships for Sacramento State students of any major! The Asian American Studies Scholarships aim to provide financial resources for underserved and underrepresented students in order to persist and succeed at Sac State and beyond. Four scholarships will be awarded to_undergraduate and graduate students in amounts of **\$5,000** each for the 2017-18 academic year.

Eligibility Requirements

- The scholarship is available for students of any major who have demonstrated a commitment and potential for leadership in the Asian American community.
- Full-time student at time of award and at the time of application.
- GPA Preferences:
 - 1. Graduate Students 3.2 and above
 - 2. Undergraduate Students 3.0 and above
- Required meeting with an Asian American Studies faculty. *Meeting must be scheduled immediately after notification of being awarded the scholarship.
- Preference may be given to applicants minoring in Asian American Studies or those who have taken at least two Asian American Studies related courses.

NOTE: Awardees of the Asian American Studies Scholarship from Fall 2015 – Spring 2017 are ineligible to apply.

NOTE: University policy states that a student is not required to perform any <u>volunteer</u> work as a reimbursement of this scholarship.

Letters of recommendation must be sealed and addressed to Dr. Gregory Mark (Asian American Studies) and Marietess Masulit, and submitted to the Ethnic Studies Department, located at **Amador 463**, by the end of the workday on **April 21, 2017**.

<u>I understand</u> that any falsification of any information may cause me to be disqualified from the scholarship application process, or result in the revocation of a scholarship I have been granted.
