approaches in economics. Routledge is publishing a <u>Critical Assessments</u> series, edited by John Wood featuring articles written on specific economists: currently, volumes on Joan Robinson, Leontief, Say, and Pareto are published. Routledge also publishes a "Library of 20th Century Economists," organized around themes—The Chicago Tradition, Socialism and the Market, Origins of Macroeconomics, etc. And, the firm has a "Critical Reviews" and Critical Responses" series. Macmillan has a new series on <u>Contemporary Economists</u>, edited by John Pheby.
