Abstract of the proposal:

The Certificate of General Studies (GE Certificate) is awarded to matriculated Sacramento State students upon their completion of 60 units, which must include completion of the lower division CSU General Education pattern. The purpose of the GE Certificate is to mark the achievement of Sacramento State students who complete a program of study analogous to an Associate Degree (AA, AS, ADT) in the California Community Colleges.

Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

The Certificate of General Studies does not create a new academic program, but rather marks a milestone achievement for our undergraduate students as they complete the existing GE program. The CSU and CSUS GE Programs are long established, have been approved by faculty, and are overseen by three Faculty Senate Committees (GEGRPC, GECRCRS, R&W Subcommittee).

Unlike Community College transfer students that typically receive an Associate Degree (AA, AS, ADT), students that start their college career at Sacramento State do not receive incremental certificates during their progress as they complete major milestones. Further, as enrollment across the country is dropping and student retention issues are increasing, the GE Certificate may also provide an alternate motivation for students to continue their education and their pathway to graduation.

Program Description

The Certificate of General Studies is awarded to matriculated Sacramento State students upon their completion of 60 units, which must include completion of the lower division CSU General Education pattern. The GE Certificate marks the achievement of Sacramento State students' completion of a program of study that would earn an Associate Degree (AA, AS, ADT) in the California Community Colleges. None of the courses in the Certificate Program have prerequisites.

Admission Requirements: Course prerequisites and other criteria for admission of students to the degree major program, and for their continuation in it.

Admission Requirements

All Sacramento State students are automatically considered for the GE Certificate and do not need to complete an application.
