Provide reasons for the program suspension.

The Ethnic Studies Department/ Pan African Studies Program is proposing a new Minor in Pan African Studies program. To accompany that, we are proposing to discontinue this Certificate in Pan African Studies program, as new students seeking a minor will be admitted into the new minor program instead of the certificate. The current Certificate students will be transitioned into the Minor. The courses in the new Minor program and the current Certificate program will be practically identical, in fact, the Minor will require 3 less units than the Certificate, so the students will easily be able to finish their coursework through the class offerings each semester.

Indicate any programmatic or fiscal impact suspension of the program will have on other academic units' programs.

None. The new Minor program will replace this one, and there should be no impact on other programs.

Describe the consultation that has occurred with affected units.

No other programs should be directly affected, so no consultation was necessary. The new Minor program has been posted on the Listserv for the college, and so all departments are aware of the new Minor program to replace this Certificate program.

Explain provisions to ensure currently enrollment students have a reasonable opportunity to complete the program.

The currently enrolled Certificate students will easily be able to complete their Minor program since the courses in both programs overlap and all will still be taught. The Minor will also require 3 less units than the Certificate, so completion of the program will be attainable. The current courses offered are also part of the new Minor program, and will continue to be offered, so students will not have any challenges meeting the Minor requirements.

All resources will be shifted to the new Minor in Pan African Studies program. There shouldn't be a change in the amount of resources needed, as the programs will continue to serve the same number of students each year and have the same number of course offerings.
