Justification for course proposal:

This edit is to address the linguistic readiness of students who take this course. Currently, it allows for students to concurrently enroll in DEAF 53 (ASL 3) while taking this course. Students simultaneously taking DEAF 53 and DEAF 57 generally have not yet reached an appropriate level to understand vocabulary and/or have the receptive skills required to understand ASL assignments for this course, and thus find themselves at a significant disadvantage compared to their peers who have already passed DEAF 53. This means that students concurrently enrolled in DEAF 53 and DEAF 57 are at risk of spending more than the expected time on this course in order to understand the assigned work, potentially taking significant time away from other courses. The area group faculty have discussed the issue and agree that it is best to remove "may be taken concurrently" from the prerequisite. ELO and assessments have been added as they were missing to align with University policy.

Students will develop increased understanding of the types and uses of classifiers in ASL and develop further abilities to utilize this component of ASL in their expressive and receptive signing abilities through in-class practice, viewing of videotaped narratives, and individual practice outside of class.
