## Justification for course proposal:

This is one of twelve Form A course proposals being submitted by the Counselor Education program as part of a new 48-unit Bachelor of Science degree major in Substance Use and Abuse Studies. The Form B for this proposed degree major will be submitted concurrently. This has been in consultation and integration of courses with Psychology and Social Work departments. This foundational core course aligns with the nationally recognized competency-based addiction counseling curriculum (Center for Substance Abuse Treatment, 2017a; SAMHSA, 2021).

This skill building course introduces the fundamental principles of Motivational Interviewing, an evidence-based model developed for addictions counseling. Examines the collaborative and goal-oriented strategies designed to acknowledge client ambivalence, strengthen intrinsic motivation to change, and support the client in developing a commitment to the change based goals of recovery. Explores individual counseling skills, including essential listening and interviewing techniques for establishing and maintaining a facilitative style in the therapeutic relationship. Includes a component on counselor self-care.
