Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

The revised name and updated courses better align our program with the field and practice of public health. Course revisions are intended to update to the curriculum, reflecting requirements that better align with our program learning objectives. The change in format, from face-to-face to hybrid, allows us to offer a combination of in-person and online courses to address student constraints in accordance with the Chancellor's office's standards. Lastly, we are removing the pre-major requirement to allow direct admission into our program. The pre-major (lower division) courses are still required, but this change allows students to declare the major before completing those required courses, thus removing one of the primary barriers to entry into the program. The pre-major requirement was installed several years ago when this program was impacted. Now that impaction has been removed, this extra barrier no longer serves the program or our students.

Program Description

The academic area of study in Public Health is part of the College of Health and Human Services. Students pursue a Public Health concentration leading to a degree with specialization and job skills applicable to one of two professional areas of study. Health Promotion or Occupational Safety & Health. The program supports focused academic preparation in each concentration such that Public Health BS graduates will have job appeal in their chosen professional field.

Students can expect to be involved in both coursework and field experiences across areas of Public Health practice and within each concentration, such as consumer health issues, alcohol and other drugs, human sexuality, health promotion, unintentional injury causes and prevention, and other personal, occupational, and community health and safety issues.

Students should check the Department website (https://www.csus.edu/college/health-human-services/public-health/) for requirements and speak with the Public Health academic advisor to help with their academic plans.

Note: Students graduating with a BS in Public Health (all concentrations) will not be subject to the University's Foreign Language Graduation Requirement. Students who change major may be subject to the University's Foreign Language Graduation Requirement.

Direct Admission

When applying to Sacramento State through CSU Apply, selecting Public Health (all concentrations) will grant admission without any additional supplemental documentation.

The Bachelor of Science in Public Health program requires 12 units of lower-division courses that should be completed prior to starting upper division coursework.

Additional Information

Repeat Policy: Public Health majors and minors can only repeat Public Health courses one time if they receive less than a "C." Students must meet with their academic advisor before petitioning the department to repeat the course. Refer to the Repeat Policy section of the Sacramento State Catalog for additional information.

Credit by Examination: A student who seeks course credit by examination is to enroll in the course to be challenged. No course may be challenged after the first two weeks of the semester. The instructor of the course will conduct an assessment of the student's readiness for the challenge for credit examination. Refer to Credit by Examination section of the Sacramento State Catalog.

Advising: It will be necessary to work very closely with an advisor to complete the BS degree in a timely manner. Therefore, the Public Health faculty strongly recommends that all Public Health students consult with an advisor prior to enrollment for any course. This procedure should be followed each semester.
