Justification for course proposal:

Updating prerequisites for the course as part of broader restructuring of BA in Anthropology curriculum. After long discussions, CLS faculty arrived at the conclusion that ANTH 141 or Anth 146 provide ample exposure to the fundamentals of cultural anthropology preparing students to engage and appreciate and the specific issues addressed within the specialized field represented by this course. The CLS faculty deemed it necessary to move away from a sequenced approach (represented by the current curricular structure) to a multi pathway approach (represented by the proposed curricular changes - see Form B submitted for BA in Anthropology (CLS concentration) engage the major curriculum.

Graduate students have always been eligible to take this, but had to be hand enrolled. Adding graduate student standing eliminates the need for office administrative staff to add graduate students manually.
