Justification for course proposal:

Updating prerequisites as part of broader restructuring of BA in Anthropology curriculum. After long discussions, cultural anthropologists in the Anthropology faculty concluded that minimizing prerequisites and providing more flexibility in the curriculum is in best interest of serving our students. In updating the prerequisites, a wider cross section of our majors can enroll for the course. This erodes bottlenecks and allows students to creatively engage the curriculum and graduate in a more timely fashion. ANTH 141 or Anth 146 provide ample exposure to the fundamentals of cultural anthropology preparing students to engage and appreciate and the specific issues addressed within the specialized field represented by this course. Graduate students have always been eligible to take this, but had to be hand enrolled. Adding graduate student standing eliminates the need for office administrative staff to add graduate students manually.

The course introduces students to major themes that inform anthropological understanding of globalization. This course will explore theoretical perspectives, topics, and methods of analysis developed in anthropology to capture the effects of intermingling global/local cultural forces and the diverse relations of power that structure them and in which they are embedded.
