Justification for course proposal:

As we work through various curricular changes, we wanted to update this course to reflect how we currently teach it. As of now students must take ANTH 192B and 195B concurrently as co-requisites, together making a 3-unit class. This 1+2 unit co-requisite structure is redundant and confusing to students, so we will be deactivating ANTH 195B and revising ANTH 192B to a 3-unit standalone class. We will also be updating the title to better reflect contemporary disciplinary terminology. We will keep ANTH 195B on the books for now during the period of old/new curricular overlap but plan to turn 195B into a separate, new, 3-unit Collaborative Ethnography Lab course at a later date.

- -Course description updated to reflect realities of how we teach this course.
- -Fieldtrips are no longer required so that has been changed in this form.
- -Prereqs changed to streamline access to the class for students, and in alignment with broader curricular reform at department and concentration level. These particular classes were chosen by the faculty as they provide the students with the foundation necessary for the course.
- -ELOs added and adjusted to reflect how we teach this course and assess learning.
- -Grading scale added to syllabus.
