Justification for course proposal:

This course is being edited for course classification to better account for the experience. This course requires both instruction of 1 hour and 50 minutes to meet accreditation requirements but it also includes supervision of internship off-site. The faculty both need the time within the classroom for group supervision but also time for individual supervision needs and for oversight of the internship with coordination of on-site supervision at various locations for which students are interning. The faculty are also responsible for mentoring site supervisors for each student placement. We think this classification better accounts for the experience both in the classroom as well as in the field and the workload for the faculty supervisors. This change was with consultation and support of the Dean.

Supervised counseling and field experiences arranged in community-based settings such schools, colleges and/or agencies. Students are to collect between 600-800 hours of field work experience in the form of direct and indirect counseling experiences as designated by specialty and aligned with CACREP, CTC, and BBS requirements. This course is designed to be taken third year in both fall and spring, collecting approximately 300 hours each semester and totaling 6 units. Department approval is required the semester prior to enrollment.
