Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

We have several new course offerings and updates to add in to our minor requirements. Specifically,

1. Nationalism in Asia (ASIA 113) and Social Movements in Asia (ASIA 114) are new courses added into our curriculum. They are minor requirement options along with Asian Migration and Diaspora (ASIA 111) to provide further understanding of the region comparatively. We also want to provide students with a few options for the required upper division courses in the minor to ensure if a faculty is on leave or unable to offer other required courses, it does not create a barrier to students seeking to complete the minor.
2. We are also removing the 12 units of upper division requirement as we accept lower division language courses toward the Minor and this inadvertently prevented students from counting the electives for credit.
