PROGRAM OVERVIEW

DESCRIPTION

The Multiple Subject Teaching Credential program is hybrid and focuses on preparing effective teachers for an urban setting, including a foundation in social justice and equity. The program offers two pathways: a 2 semester and a 3 semester. It authorizes the holder to teach all subjects in a self-contained classroom, typically in most elementary schools. This credential embeds the English Learner Authorization (ELA), which prepares candidates to work with second language learners.

Upon completion of the credential coursework, candidates will have the option to complete an additional sequence of five Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) courses. Candidates will learn how to critically examine the sociocultural and sociopolitical contexts related to the broad fields of educational research and schooling. Candidates will apply such analytical skills to develop and implement standards-based curriculum in diverse settings using best instructional and inclusive practices that positively impact the learning of all students including English Learners and students with disabilities. Candidates will also create an original Teacher Action Research Inquiry Project using practice-based methods in diverse educational settings.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Critically analyze historical and contemporary purposes, roles and functions of education in American society;
- Identify historical origins and principles of educational equity and critically analyze the implementation of these principles in schools;
- Demonstrate the ability to differentiate and adapt assessment and instruction using a variety of evidence-based strategies and inclusive practices;
- Use assessment data collected during the cycle of teaching as a foundation for improving their teaching and their students' learning;
- Explore/integrate major concepts, principles, theories, and research related to the cognitive, social, and cultural development of children;
- Critically analyze and apply Teacher Action Research approaches and designs;
- Describe and analyze data collection tools and methods used to conduct the Teacher Action Research;
- Explain how data is used to inform teaching, curriculum development, and educational policy and systemic practices;

PROGRAM OPTIONS

- Complete the credential and MAT coursework within two academic years
- 2-semester / 3-semester credential coursework options
- Summer + 2 semesters (part-time) MAT coursework
- Candidate who wish to pursue the MAT coursework at a later date can do so

- Overall GPA of 2.5 (or 2.75 in last 60 semester / 90 quarter units)
