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DESCRIPTION

The Single Subject Teaching Credential is a 1-year hybrid program with a focus on preparing effective teachers for an urban setting, including a foundation in social justice and equity. It authorizes the holder to provide instruction in approved subject areas in a departmentalized classroom. This credential embeds the English Learner Authorization (ELA), which prepares candidates to work with second language learners.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Upon completion of the credential coursework, candidates will have the option to complete an additional sequence of five Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) courses. Candidates will learn how to critically examine the sociocultural and sociopolitical contexts related to the broad fields of educational research and schooling. Candidates will apply such analytical skills to develop and implement standards-based curriculum in diverse settings using best instructional and inclusive practices that positively impact the learning of all students including English Learners and students with disabilities. Candidates will also create an original Teacher Action Research Inquiry Project using practice-based methods in diverse educational settings.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Critically analyze historical and contemporary purposes, roles and functions of education in American society;
- Identify historical origins and principles of educational equity and critically analyze the implementation of these principles in schools;
- Demonstrate the ability to differentiate and adapt assessment and instruction using a variety of evidence-based strategies and inclusive practices;
- Use assessment data collected during the cycle of teaching as a foundation for improving their teaching and their students' learning;
- Explore/integrate major concepts, principles, theories, and research related to the cognitive, social, and cultural development of children and adolescents;
- Critically analyze and apply Teacher Action Research approaches and designs;
- Describe and analyze data collection tools and methods used to conduct the Teacher Action Research;
- Explain how data is used to inform teaching, curriculum development, and educational policy and systemic practices;

- Summer + 2 semesters (part-time) MAT coursework
