



Enrollment data in sections 2-5, were collected at Census Date—four weeks after the first day of instruction each semester. They are the "official" numbers for State and Federal reporting.

Ethnic headcounts in this section, and all other sections may differ from those reported before 2014. The Fact Book now uses new ERSR (Race/Ethnicity) data, collected since 2009, to complete the historical record.






Basic New Student Admission Statistics







Sacramento State Enrollment by CA County Fall 2016















Long Term Trend of Degrees Awarded






Progression Rate refers to the proportion of a cohort who progressed to higher class levels and who left the university in the beginning of each year.





Retention Rates by College







Progression Rates of Transfers











2016 Living Alumni of Sacramento State by California County




2016 Living Alumni of Sacramento State by State
