- 4. UARTP Update
 - The UARTP committee voted on the revised NSM RTP document yesterday but the results have not been sent out yet. It is likely it was approved and will move to the

Provost for approval next. The changes for next year's review cycle include new timelines and distribution of files among the two committees which, for next year, will include 8 tenure/promotion to associate, 9 promotions to full and 12 retention reviews. In anticipation of the changes being approved, a call to all faculty can go out this semester for self-nominations for the review committee on which they would like to serve. The retention committee is a good opportunity for associate professors to perform service to the college as well as giving them a chance to see what faculty are doing in other departments.

- 5. Budget Planning/Outlook
 - The campus is projecting a \$12.5M deficit which comes out to 5-6% of the campus budget overall. The Provost has tasked the Deans with coming up with ways to a 6% cut including personnel costs.
