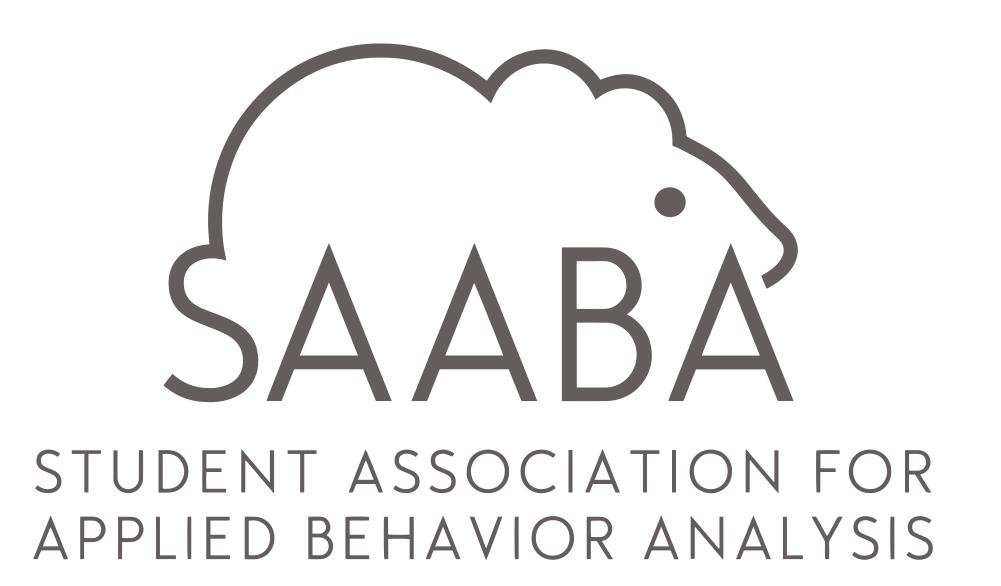

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is a scientific approach aimed at understanding environmental variables that reliably influence socially significant behavior and developing behavior-change technologies based on this understanding.

The goals of the ABA program are to teach students to think critically and scientifically about behavioral processes and to enable students to enter doctoral programs in ABA. The program also prepares students for careers in ABA by passing the national certification examination (BCBA).

Students in the ABA program have the opportunity to design and conduct state of the art research on a variety of applied and basic behavioral topics. Our research facilities include human and animal (rat) operant laboratories, a campus clinic, and research rooms for data collection with children and adults. We have also established research partnerships with various schools and agencies in the region, as well as nationally and internationally.

Clinical training is an integral part of our program. Students obtain clinical experience working closely with one of our community partners. There are numerous funded internships and job opportunities for ABA students in Sacramento.
