## Peer Mentor in Sociology (SOC Circle) – Overview

The Sociology Department is glad you are interested in being a peer mentor in the upcoming semester. **Peer Mentoring in Sociology** is offered as a two-unit class for mentors (SOC193B, which requires faculty permission – Dr. Welkley).

This mentoring program provides an opportunity to give supportive guidance to peers majoring in **sociology**, while learning alongside other mentors. The overall purpose of SOC193 is to help students meet their goals for academic success and timely graduation. This is achieved through the following opportunities in the course whether one is a *mentor* (an individual who provides guidance) or *mentee* (an individual who is new to Sacramento State and/or the Sociology Major):

- Learn about our campus community,
- Gain experience in leadership, interpersonal communication skills, and helping others reach their academic goals.
- Become acquainted with other majors and faculty in the Sociology Department, and
- Build productive relationships that can support academic and professional success.

## Eligibility

The process of being selected includes: 1) completing this application (may be waived if have already taken SOC193A); 2) 2.8 GPA; 3) a letter/email of reference from an instructor at Sacramento State; and 4) an interview meeting via Zoom with Dr. Welkley. Additionally, to be eligible for SOC193B and be a mentor, students must have either been at Sac State for at least two semesters or one semester and successfully completed SOC193A.

**Please note:** Dr. Welkley can make some allowances for some of these eligibility criteria. If you are interested in being a mentor.... APPLY, so that your application can be processed and then eligibility can be discussed.

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## Application Questions

After you complete the following ten (10) questions, please email your completed application to Dr. Welkley, [welkleyd@csus.edu](mailto:welkleyd@csus.edu). She will then set up a time to meet with before enrolling you in the course.

1. Why are you interested in being a mentor in sociology?
2. What does being a “mentor” mean to you?
3. What do you feel you can provide to mentees in this program?
4. How would you describe your style of communication and relationship building skills?

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5. How would you go about building rapport (a bond or connection) with mentee(s) you are assigned?
6. Describe your time-management and organization skills.
7. Describe your two greatest strengths **and** two areas that you believe need to be strengthened. Please also explain why.
8. What do you believe you will gain from this mentoring experience?
9. Are you available to **attend SOC193 on Wednesday, 11am – 11:50am**, during the **FALL 2025** semester? Class will be conducted in Del Norte 1010. We will also have an **orientation** the week before the semester begins for mentors to participate in – **August 21st, 2025 (TBD)**.

- 2) qualities that stand out that they believe would contribute to your role as a mentor.

The reference letter can be sent to Dr. Welkley after your interview/meeting or before. Either is fine.
