Sacramento State is dedicated to protecting the rights of all members of our diverse, global campus community and to promoting an environment that is safe, inclusive, and welcoming to all, regardless of immigration status.

IF YOU ARE APPROACHED BY IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT OR OTHER FEDERAL AGENTS:

- Ask for their name, identification number, agency affiliation, and contact information.
- Inform them that you are not obstructing their process, but that you do not have the authority to respond to their request.
- REMEMBER that employees, including faculty, are prohibited from sharing any information about students with anyone.
