In Memoriam...

HUBERT J. McCORMICK

Services for Dr. Hubert J. McCormick, longtime professor of health and physical education at CSUS and Dean of Educational Services and Summer Session at the time of his retirement in 1973, were held at East Lawn Chapel on Wednesday, September 7, 1988. Dr. McCormick, 83, died Saturday, September 3 at his retirement home in Union City,

In addition to his teaching and administrative services at CSUS, "Mac" taught at the University of Oregon, CSU Chico and the University of Wyoming during his professional career. He was instrumental in gaining membership of CSUS in the National University Extension Association. He also guided the development and administration of the first CSU external degree program (Criminal Justice) prior to his retirement.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Ruth. He left one surviving brother, Bryon, of Fresno.

GERARD P. CLEISZ

Dr. Gerard P Cleisz, professor emeritus of French, died on August 18, 1988. Dr. Cleisz was a member of the CSUS Department of French/Italian from 1960 until he retired in 1973. He served as chair of this department and was very instrumental in developing the foreign language programs at CSUS.

Dr. Cleisz earned his doctorate from the Ohio State University and was an internationally recognized scholar and authority on Andre Gide and Albert Camus. He is remembered by faculty in foreign languages as a master teacher whose humanistic qualities and dedication to academic excellence inspired several generations of students and many colleagues.
