Google Chrome

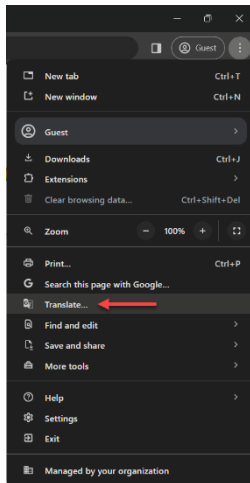
Step 1: Open Google Chrome

First, launch Google Chrome on your computer. You should see the Chrome browser window open up on your screen.

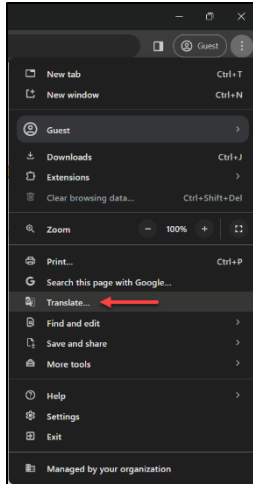
Step 2: Navigate to a webpage in a different language

Go to a webpage that is in a language you want to translate. For example, let's say you want to translate a webpage from Spanish to English.

Step 3: Locate the Translation Icon

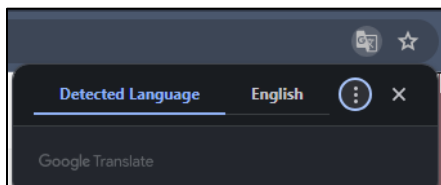


If Chrome detects that the webpage is in a language different from your default language, it will automatically display the translation icon. It is located in the address bar at the top of the Chrome window, you'll see the small icon (a gray circle with a letter "A" inside) appear on the right side. If you do not see the icon, you can activate translation by visiting the settings found at the top right of the browser.



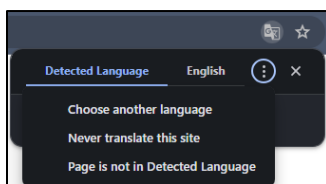
Step 4: Activate Translation

Activate translation by clicking on the icon or through the menu and a pop-up window will appear with the translation options.



Step 5: Choose Your Preferred Language

In the translation pop-up, you'll see the original language of the webpage detected by Chrome and the language it can be translated to. Click on the dropdown menu to select the language you want the webpage to be translated into.



Step 6: Review the Translated Page

Once you select your preferred language, Chrome will automatically translate the webpage into the chosen language. You can now read the webpage in your desired language.

Microsoft Edge

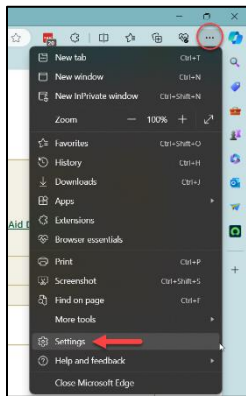
Step 1: Open Microsoft Edge

First, launch Microsoft Edge on your computer. You should see the Microsoft Edge browser window open up on your screen.

Step 2: Navigate to a webpage in a different language

Go to a webpage that is in a language you want to translate. For example, let's say you want to translate a webpage from Spanish to English.

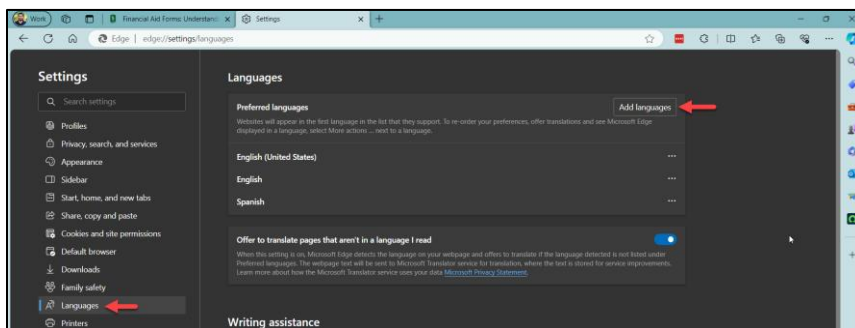
Step 3: Access Browser Settings

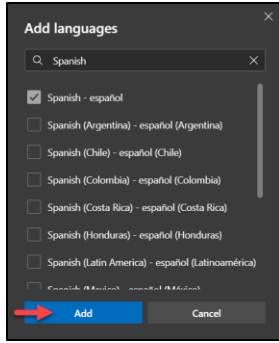


Click on the 3 dots on the top right of the window and click on settings

Step 4: Add Preferred Language

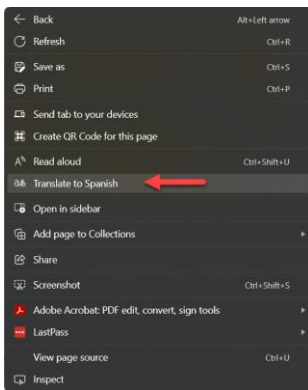
Navigate to the Languages section and click on “Add languages”. Search and select your preferred language(s) and click on Add.





Step 5: Activate Translation

Now right-click on the page you wish to translate and select the Translate to Spanish option.



Mozilla Firefox

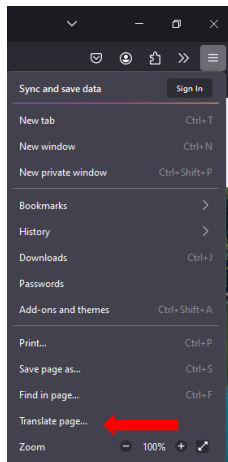
Step 1: Open Mozilla FireFox

First, launch Mozilla Firefox on your computer. You should see the Firefox browser window open up on your screen.

Step 2: Navigate to a webpage in a different language

Go to a webpage that is in a language you want to translate. For example, let's say you want to translate a webpage from Spanish to English.

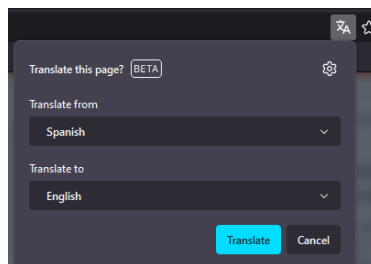
Step 3: Locate the Translation Icon



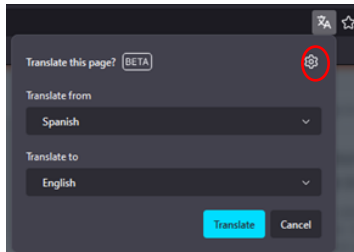
If Firefox detects that the webpage is in a language different from your default language, it will automatically display the translation icon. It is located in the address bar at the top of the Firefox window, you'll see the small icon (a gray circle with a letter "A" inside) appear on the right side. If you do not see the icon, you can activate translation by visiting the settings found at the top right of the browser.

Step 4: Activate Translations

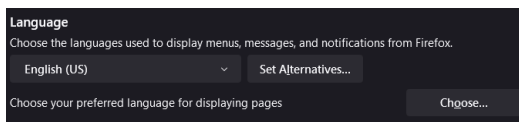
Activate translation by clicking on the icon or through the menu and a pop-up window will appear with the translation options. Once you have selected the language options, click on "Translate."



Step 5: Choose Your Preferred Language



In the translation pop-up, you'll see the original language of the webpage detected by Chrome and the language it can be translated to. Click on the settings menu and click on manage language



Click on choose, and you are able to select your preferred languages, and click on add. Once you see your preferred language, press "OK."

Step 6: Review the Translated Page

Once you select your preferred language, Firefox will automatically translate the webpage into the chosen language. You can now read the webpage in your desired language.

Safari

Step 1: Open Safari

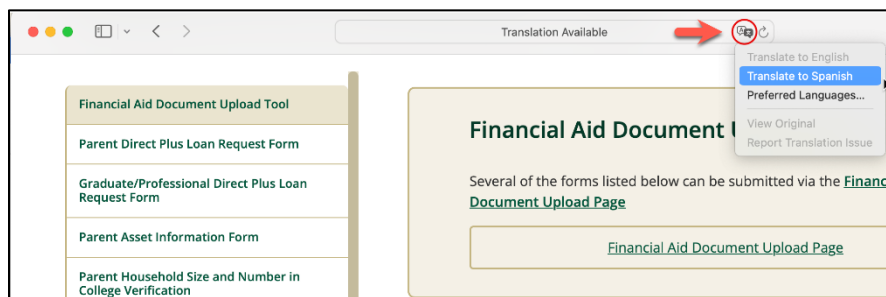
First, launch Safari on your computer. You should see the Safari browser window open on your screen.

Step 2: Navigate to a webpage in a different language

Go to a webpage that is in a language you want to translate. For example, let's say you want to translate a webpage from Spanish to English.

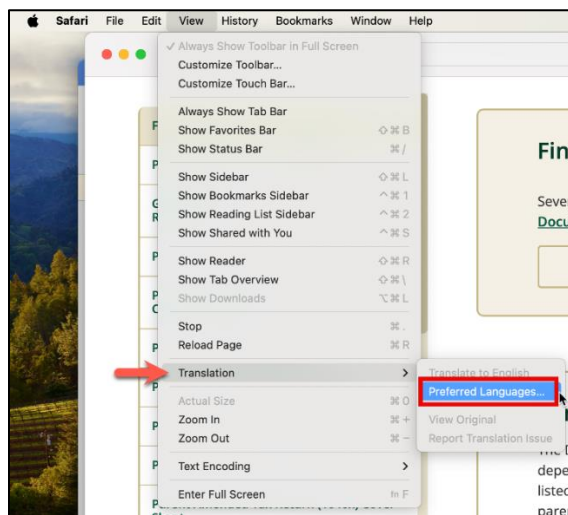
Step 3: Locate the Translation Icon

If Safari detects that the webpage is in a language different from your preferred language, it will automatically display the translation icon. It is located in the address bar at the top of the Safari window, you'll see the small icon appear on the right side. **If you do not see the icon, you can activate translation by following Steps 4 through 8.**



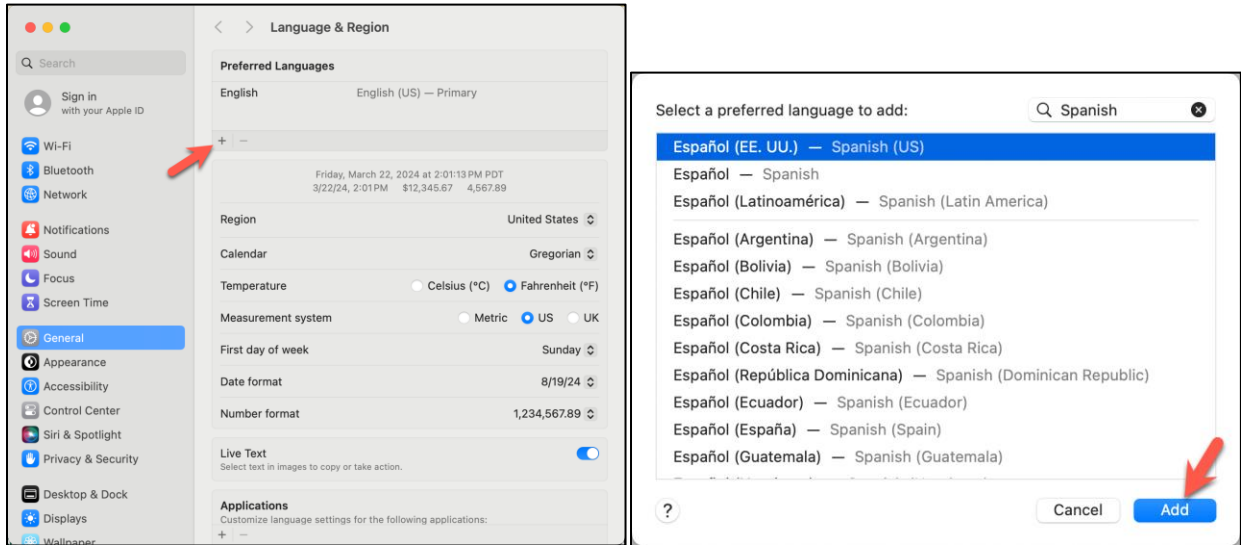
Step 4: Set Your Preferred Languages

Click on View → Translation → Preferred Languages...



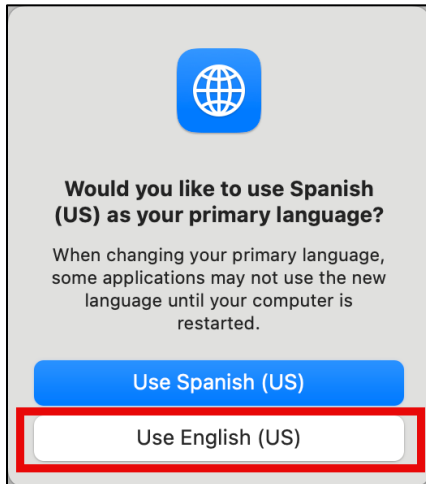
Step 5: Add Preferred Languages

On the Language & Region screen, click on the plus sign and search for the language you need. Once found select it and click Add.



Step 6: Choose Primary Language

You will be prompted to choose Spanish or English as your primary language. Choose English to receive the translation prompt when on an English screen.



Step 7: Activate Translation without Icon

If you do not see the translation icon, you can manually start translation by navigating to View → Translation → Translate to Spanish
