Associated Students, Inc. Board of Directors Assessment Report 2023-24

Background

Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) conducted assessment of their Board of Directors for the 2023-24 academic year to gauge the growth and professional development of its members over the course of the year. A pre/post survey was conducted to evaluate skills and abilities the experience of serving on the Board is intended to strengthen. 13 board members completed the pre-survey, and seven board members completed the post-survey.

The ASI Board of Directors serves as the official governing body of Sacramento State students. It is comprised of a variety of students elected by the student body during the spring semester. The Board meets regularly to discuss issues facing the student body. It includes five Executive Officers, a representative from each College, a representative for Undeclared Students, and a representative for Graduate Students. Elected members of the Board serve a term of one academic year contingent on their ability to meet and maintain all eligibility criteria to hold office.

Discussion

Overall, the board members improved in a majority of the skills and abilities measured in the survey; 12 out of the 19 measures improved or remained at 100% from the pre to the post-assessment. Board members reported improvement in all areas related to diversity, equity and relationship-building. The areas where their scores dipped in the post-survey were related to advanced leadership skills such as conflict resolution, helping group members develop a sense of shared purpose, and advocating for a point of view. It may be that their experience on the Board of Directors helped them to become more aware of areas of growth for themselves related to these skills. In the future, ASI will explore offering professional development workshops or other learning opportunities to board members to help them further develop in these areas.
