As a result of the Rainbow Ally training, here's what the participants have to say:

- 77% strongly agree that they are knowledgeable about the marginalization faced by LGBTQIA2+ individuals.
- 84% strongly agree that they are knowledgeable about the on-campus resources available to support LGBTQIA2+ individuals.
- 94% strongly agree that they are confident in their ability to be an ally for LGBTQIA2+ identified members of the Sac Sate community.
- 87% strongly agree that they are aware of existing resources, services, and opportunities to engage with the PRIDE Center.
- 87% strongly agree that they are confident in their ability to advocate for LGBTQ+ students.
